PROGRAM #1 - UPROOTED

Length: 17 Min

Notes:

If a teacher is not present to keep the discussion flowing and on track, the use of a facilitator is highly recommended.

Depending on the specific audience and the facilitator, some Suggestions for Discussion questions could also include Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders.

Suggestions for Discussion:

- 1. Did your family or ancestors immigrate to the United States? If so, describe hardships they may have faced due to prejudice.
- 2. Have you ever been ostracized or picked on because of your appearance? Describe your experience and how you felt about it?
- 3. Have you ever ostracized or picked on someone because of their appearance? Describe your experience and how you felt about it?
- 4. What happened to the homes, properties, businesses, and bank accounts of the Japanese Americans who were taken from their homes?
- 5. What fueled the hate many people had for the Japanese Americans?
- 6. What fuels the hate today that people have for Asian Americans?
- 7. What would you say to your friends about Japanese Americans then?
- 8. What would you say to your friends about Asian Americans today?
- 9. As an Asian American parent of young children, what would you fear for yourself and your children, today?
- 10. Has anyone in the class, workplace or neighborhood ever felt excluded in some way. If so, invite any volunteers to share their experience with classmates or group members.

After discussions have ended ask volunteer viewers what they are thinking/feeling.
